Industry Expert Guest Lecture on Current Trends in Pharma Industry By an eminent speaker Mr Rajesh M Argulwar

Guest Lecture commenced with the Saraswati pujan. Adorable Principal Prof Dr A V Chandewar gave his view on the topic changing trends in Pharma industry & made students aware of understanding the global need to adopt changes in Pharma trends. Mr Girish D Darwhekar Lecturer introduced the speaker, Mr Rajesh M Argulwar, Assistant Manager, Drug Regulatory Affairs (US Market), Alkem Laboratories Ltd Mumbai. His talk was mainly a comparison of the western and Indian scenario of pharmacy education and research. He commenced the talk with an article titled "Current Trends in Pharma Industry" which he had published based on his research and industrial experience in the Alkem Laboratories Ltd Mumbai during his tenure. He discussed various strengths and weakness of our Indian pharmaceutical education system major of which was the vast curriculum which seemed to be a benefit and flaw at the same time. He emphasized the fact that though the

syllabus will cater students aspiring for all fields, at the same time by the end of the UG course it could pose burden to who have limited future plans. He suggested the western approach of elective and selective courses in final year as a solution to the same. He also advised to include phycology into the curriculum so as to mould the students into better human beings before being professionals. In terms of research, Mr Rajesh M Argulwar appreciated the intelligence and active foreign participation of Indians but pointed out the major drawbacks in Indian manpower as lack of inclusiveness and multi-discipline integration.
